$^{\Gamma}$ Introduction]


Raising children is a difficult task. If it was meant to be easy, this relationship wouldn't start with labor pain. Children are great teachers of prayer. Child rearing teaches us to pray. Parenting often comes with feeling utterly helpless.

For the family month of May, we will be learning how to pray for our children. You may also use this material to pray for your spouse or parents. May this family month be a time of showing gratitude to our parents and blessing our children.

(1) Demanding parents, passive parents

It is surprising how seldom books on parenting talk about prayer. We instinctively believe that if we have the right biblical principles and apply them consistently, our kids will turn out right. However, raising children in faith is not something we can be too confident about. Many parents are initially confident we can change our child. We don't surrender to our child's will (which is good), but we try to dominate the child with our own (which is bad). Without realizing it, we become demanding. Increasingly, parents in our culture are moving to the opposite extreme and becoming passive. Parents say things like "My son has always been angry" or "Even when he was a kid, he was throwing temper tantrums." This passivity can in turn cause worse behaviors in the child. Until you are convinced that you can't change your child's heart, you will not take prayer seriously.

(2) Watch God's story unfold

One word summarizes our prayers for Emily: faith. We wanted her to abide in God. When our daughter is going through a difficult time we often say, "We are thankful Emily has this low-level suffering while she is still on our watch. It is a wonderful opportunity for her to grow in faith." Because we were praying thoughtfully for Emily, we could see God's larger picture weaving in and through her disappointments. God permitted mild pain in her life in order to grow her soul into his. We've given up on our ability to change other people. Instead, we cling to God and watch him weave his story. Frankly, we do our best parenting by prayer.

Hebrews 12:2

"Looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." [Meditate] The heavenly Father loves our children more than we do. We might be ready to die for them, but God actually died for them. In whose picture do you want your child(ren) to grow? What must you surrender?

(3) The Image of God

Parents are the images of God on earth. Children learn about their heavenly Father through their earthly fathers. And children learn about the caring and loving Church through their earthly mothers. God delights in working through parents in passing down, preserving, and spreading the faith to the next generation. No pretense, hypocrisy, or flattery does good for the family. It is through parents who have the character and love of Jesus that our children will learn to fear God. Another point to remember is this. No parents are ever flawless. It is not perfection that our children seek, but honesty and sincerity.
