05 The Mission of the Church

What is the God-given mission of the church? In essence, the local churches cannot have different missions. The church is a covenantal community called to carry out 3 missions: to worship God, to witness Christ, and to nurture the saints.

- 4) The posture and attitude of the worshiper
 - (1) Only the Bible, and no other materials, can be the basis of worship.

(2) The formal service is first and foremost the meeting of the Triune God with His chosen people before it is about the gathering of God's people.

(3) The worshiper must perceive that Christ is the only Mediator, and it is only through Him that we can go before God.

(4) Basic elements of worship in the Christian tradition: Scripture reading, praise, prayer, preaching of the Word, offering, confession of faith, sacraments, dedication and commitment	The mission of nurture We need to be constantly nurtured to become a true worshiper and passionate witness.
