## The Condition of True Repentance

Jeremiah 3:19 ~ 4:4, 새찬송 278 장 **Ice - Breaker,** 지난 주 동안 말씀을 통해 하나님의 인도를 경험한 것을 나누며 서로 마음을 여십시오.

The way to restoration is repentance, not avoidance. When the Israelites, who had betrayed God like a wife who unfaithful to her husband, confessed their sins and returned to God, Gods restoration and Salvation would begin.

God declared this condition of true repentance to the Israelites.

#### > The word and Sharing

**Sharing 3.** What God wants is not physical circumcision, but spiritual circumcision; not perfunctory repentance, but earnest repentance. Let's look back and see whether we comfort ourselves with only religious activity [superficial repentance] without any real change in our lives.
