The Potter and a Broken Clay Bottle

Jeremiah 19:1~13, 새찬송 180 장

Ice - Breaker, 지난 주 동안 말씀을 통해 하나님의 인도를 경험한 것을 나누며 서로 마음을 여십시오.

At God's command, Jeremiah bought and smashed a clay bottle, that symbolized Judah's broken state, and he listed Judah's sins in the Valley of ben Hinnom, where God's judgement would fall on them. Jeremiah also proclaimed that the judgement on Judah was irreversible, just a broken jar cannot be made whole again.

> The word and Sharing

1. Jeremiah prophesied Judah's judgement in the Valley of Ben Hinnom, the place of sins (vv. 1-6)

- 1) What did God command Jeremiah to do (vv. 1-2)?
- 2) Why did God bring disaster on Judah in the Valley of Ben Hinnom (vv. 3-5)?
- 3) To what name did God change the name of the Valley of Ben Hinnom (v. 6)?

Sharing 1. Idolatry starts from greed. It may seem like people serve idols, but actually people are using idols to serve themselves. But the result of greed is destruction. Let's look and see whether there are elements of idolatry that can be judge by God in our lives and in our culture.

Sharing 2. God chose the Valley of Ben Hinnom as the place of the judgement, because the people of Judah had disgraced that place with their sins. How would our places (families, homes, workplaces, churches, communities, etc.) look to God? Is there anything we need to do to make our places clean, so that God will remain in them?

2. God proclaimed his irreversible judgement against Judah and the Israelites (vv. 7-13)
